In the process, he has worked closely with dozens of governments, companies, international organizations and NGOs in both developed and developing countries. His dispute settlement experience ranges from trade remedy disputes (in particular, dumping and CVD cases) to highly technical SPS, TBT and TRIPS cases and more standard GATT and agricultural disputes.
