# L'INSTITUT EN BREF

## ABOUT THE GRADUATE INSTITUTE

L'Institut de hautes études internationales et du développement est un établissement universitaire de recherche et d'enseignement postgrade, spécialisé dans l'étude des affaires mondiales, au croisement des relations internationales et des questions de développement.

L'Institut a été accrédité en 2009 par le gouvernement suisse et est inscrit depuis 2012 dans la législation cantonale comme l'une des hautes écoles soutenues par l'État de Genève, au même titre que l'Université de Genève.

Installé au coeur de la Genève internationale, l'Institut offre des programmes d'études disciplinaires et interdisciplinaires au niveau du master et du doctorat. Il produit une recherche à la fois fondamentale et appliquée sur les principales thématiques du monde international contemporain. Il a également pour vocation d'offrir une expertise ainsi que des programmes de formation et d'être une plateforme de débat et de dialogue à l'intention des acteurs internationaux, en particulier dans les champs d'activité suivants :

- la coopération internationale, qu'il s'agisse d'administrations nationales à rayon d'action international (ministères des affaires étrangères, du commerce, de l'économie, de la santé, banques centrales, etc.), d'organisations intergouvernementales ou encore d'organisations non gouvernementales
- les affaires internationales, notamment les entreprises multinationales, le secteur financier, les cabinets d'avocats, les sociétés de conseil et de relations publiques
- l'analyse des questions internationales, à savoir l'enseignement et la recherche universitaire, les think tanks, les fondations internationales, les médias, etc.

The Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies is an institution of research and higher education dedicated to the study of world affairs, with a particular emphasis on the cross-cutting fields of international relations and development issues.

The Institute was accredited in 2009 by the Swiss government and has been enshrined in cantonal legislation since 2012 as one of the institutions of higher education supported by the State of Geneva, along with the University of Geneva.

Situated in the heart of International Geneva, the Institute offers disciplinary and interdisciplinary master and PhD programmes. It produces both fundamental and applied research focusing on today's major international issues. It also provides expertise and training programmes and is a platform for debate and dialogue for international actors, in particular from the following fields:

- international cooperation, including national administrations working on international issues (ministries of foreign affairs, trade, economy, health, central banks, etc.), intergovernmental as well as non-governmental organisations
  - international business, notably multinational companies, the finance sector, law firms, consulting and public relations agencies
  - analysis of global issues, such as university-level teaching and research, think tanks, international foundations, the media, etc.

## STUDY PROGRAMMES

### **Masters interdisciplinaires**

Les MAI et MDEV préparent les étudiants à leur insertion sur le marché du travail en leur offrant une perspective transversale des affaires internationales et du développement tout en leur conférant des savoirs pratiques et des compétences professionnelles.

### **Masters et doctorats disciplinaires**

Formant des experts aptes à manier concepts et méthodologies, les programmes disciplinaires mettent l'accent sur une spécialisation sans pour autant négliger les apports des autres disciplines. Les étudiants des programmes de master doivent suivre un certain nombre de crédits dans les autres disciplines enseignées à l'Institut. Ceux des programmes de doctorat peuvent suivre une mineure dans une autre discipline.

### **Interdisciplinary Masters**

The MIA and MDEV programmes prepare students to enter the global workplace by providing them with cross-cutting perspectives of international affairs and development as well as giving them practical knowledge and professional skills.

### **Disciplinary Masters and PhDs**

- Anthropology and Sociology of Development
- International Law
- International Economics
- Development Economics (PhD only)
- International History
- International Relations/Political Science

These disciplinary programmes prepare students to be experts in a specialised field and provide them with a range of conceptual and methodological skills without neglecting the contributions of the other key disciplines: in the master programmes, a certain number of credits must be obtained in a complementary discipline; in the PhD programmes, a minor may be obtained in a complementary discipline.

### **Principal characteristics of graduate studies at the Institute**

- Continuously updated teaching programmes based on innovative and independent research
- Supervision by an attentive and internationally respected academic faculty
- Courses with a low number of students favouring exchange and interaction between faculty and participants
- A bilingual environment that allows students to express themselves and submit their work in either English or French
- Close ties to International Geneva and the city's academic institutions
- Exceptional work environment within the Campus de la paix

# STRUCTURES DES PROGRAMMES

## PROGRAMME STRUCTURES

### Programmes de master

**Durée** : 4 semestres consécutifs (120 ECTS)

**Déroulement\*** : en principe, trois semestres de cours et un quatrième semestre consacré à la rédaction du mémoire.

Le troisième semestre peut être effectué auprès d'une université partenaire dans le cadre d'un programme d'échange.

Un semestre comprend théoriquement 5 enseignements de 2 heures hebdomadaires.

### Programmes de doctorat

**Durée** : 8 semestres

**Déroulement\*** : les cours sont à suivre durant les deux premiers semestres (24-36 ECTS selon le département). Les semestres suivants sont consacrés à la rédaction et à la soutenance de la thèse. Une mineure dans une autre discipline (18 ECTS et codirection) est possible.

**Filière accélérée** : possibilité d'effectuer le cursus MA/PhD en 10 semestres au lieu de 12.

\* Seuls les règlements d'études et les directives internes font foi en matière de modalités d'évaluation et d'octroi des crédits.

### Master Programmes

**Duration**: 4 consecutive semesters (120 ECTS)

**Process\***: in principle, three semesters consist of courses and the fourth semester is dedicated to the preparation of the dissertation.

The third semester can be completed at a partner university through the Institute's exchange programmes. One semester generally consists of 5 2-hour courses per week.

### PhD Programmes

**Duration**: 8 semesters

**Process\***: courses must be taken during the first two semesters (24–36 ECTS depending on the department). The following semesters are dedicated to the preparation and the defence of the thesis. PhD students can take a minor in another discipline (18 ECTS and codirected).

**Fast track**: it is possible to complete the master and PhD curricula in 10 semesters instead of 12.

\* Only the academic regulations and implementation guidelines govern the terms of evaluation and the granting of credits.

# MASTERS INTERDISCIPLINAIRES

## INTERDISCIPLINARY MASTERS

### Master en affaires internationales (MAI)

### Master in International Affairs (MIA)

Le master en affaires internationales offre une approche interdisciplinaire de l'étude de la gouvernance internationale. Il combine un cours obligatoire sur la gouvernance, des cours d'introduction dans les disciplines de l'économie, de l'histoire, du droit, de la science politique et de la sociologie, des cours de méthodologie qualitative et quantitative, et le choix d'un axe de spécialisation dans lequel les étudiants choisissent des cours bidisciplinaires et optionnels. Le programme comprend également un séminaire de recherche appliquée (ARS) et des ateliers qui leur donneront les outils techniques nécessaires à une analyse et une prise de décision efficaces. Les axes de spécialisation portent notamment sur la coopération multilatérale, l'intégration régionale, la sécurité, la résolution des conflits, la société civile et les questions transnationales.

The Master in International Affairs provides an interdisciplinary approach to the study of international governance. It combines a compulsory course on governance, introductory courses in the disciplines of economics, history, law, political science and sociology, courses on methods (both quantitative and qualitative), and the choice of a specialisation track in which students take bidisciplinary courses and electives. In addition, the programme includes an Applied Research Seminar (ARS) and professional workshops providing them with the tools that are necessary for effective analysis and decision-making. Specialisation tracks include multilateral cooperation, regional integration, global security, conflict management as well as civil society and transnational issues.

# Master en études du développement (MDEV)

## Master in Development Studies (MDEV)

Le master en études du développement propose une approche interdisciplinaire de l'étude des politiques et des processus de développement. Il combine une formation aux méthodes quantitatives et qualitatives, des cours introduisant au regard sur le développement porté par les disciplines de l'anthropologie/sociologie, l'économie, l'histoire, le droit et l'économie politique, et une spécialisation dans l'un des trois axes suivants : développement humain et social, conflits et développement, développement et soutenabilité. Il comprend aussi un séminaire de recherche appliquée (ARS) et des ateliers proposant des outils nécessaires à une prise de décision efficace.

The Master in Development Studies offers an interdisciplinary approach to the study of the policies and processes of development. The programme combines training in quantitative and qualitative methods with courses providing a perspective on development from the disciplines of Anthropology/Sociology, Economics, History, Law, and Political Economy, and a specialisation in one of three critical areas: Human and Social Development, Conflict and Development and Development and Sustainability. It also includes an Applied Research Seminar (ARS) as well as workshops providing the tools for effective decision-making.

### Master en anthropologie et sociologie du développement

### Master in Anthropology and Sociology of Development

D'une durée de deux ans, le master en anthropologie et sociologie du développement est un programme destiné aux étudiants intéressés par l'étude comparée, décentrée et critique des défis et dilemmes du développement dans toutes les régions du monde, y compris les pays du Sud. Axé sur la contribution spécifique de l'anthropologie et de la sociologie aux études internationales, le programme offre aux étudiants un ensemble d'outils méthodologiques et analytiques leur permettant d'explorer quatre thématiques clés : État, droit, pouvoir et conflits ; processus transnationaux, espaces, populations et mobilité ; changements et mouvements sociaux ; culture et identité.

The Master in Anthropology and Sociology of Development is a programme designed for students interested in the comparative study of global issues from below, from the margins, and across borders. It explores the challenges and dilemmas of development in a critical perspective as pertaining to all regions in the world, including the Global South. Courses in the programme engage with theoretical approaches and methodological tools in anthropology and sociology in order to enable students to explore four key themes: state, law, power and conflict; transnationalisation, space, and mobility; social movements and transformations; culture and identity.

The PhD programme is designed to take a maximum of four years after the Institute's master programme or a related master programme from another university. During their doctoral studies, candidates are required to obtain 24 course credits and defend a preliminary thesis dissertation before completing fieldwork and writing their doctoral thesis.

## Master en droit international Master in International Law

Au cours de leur master en droit international, les étudiants acquièrent les compétences et les connaissances nécessaires à une analyse rigoureuse des questions juridiques internationales. Ce programme associe une solide formation de base dans les domaines clés du droit international (création du droit international, règlement des différends internationaux, droit international privé, histoire et philosophie du droit) à une formation approfondie dans un ou plusieurs domaine(s) plus spécialisé(s), comprenant entre autres le droit du commerce international, le droit des investissements, le droit international pénal, la protection internationale des droits humains, le droit de l'environnement, les différends territoriaux ou la théorie du droit international.

The Master in International Law provides students with the skills and knowledge necessary for rigorous analysis of contemporary international legal issues. It couples a solid background in the main areas of international law (international law-making, international dispute settlement, private international law, history and philosophy of law) with advanced training in one or more specialised areas (including trade and investment law, international criminal law, international protection of human rights, environmental law, territorial disputes and international law theory).

Le présent plan d'études a été pensé selon une charge idéale de 30 crédits ECTS par semestre, afin que le quatrième semestre puisse être consacré à la seule rédaction du mémoire de master. L'étudiant a la possibilité d'étaler les cours optionnels sur les semestres 1 à 4 mais doit prendre en compte :

- la répartition des crédits entre les cours suivis dans la discipline de spécialisation et les cours suivis dans les disciplines complémentaires (voir « structure générale » ci-dessus) ;

This curriculum has been designed according to an ideal course load of 30 ECTS credits per semester, so that the fourth semester can be devoted to the writing of the Master dissertation. Each student is allowed to spread out the elective courses over semesters 1 to 4, but must take into account the following regulations:

- Students must take a certain number of courses in their discipline of specialisation and in complementary disciplines (see outline above);
- It is obligatory for students to obtain a minimum of 18 ECTS credits each semester;
- Failed courses cannot be repeated during the fourth semester of studies.

Students interested in the fast track option must obtain the 90 course credits required by the curriculum by the end of the third semester. During the third semester, these students can also take in advance 6 ECTS credits from the 24 ECTS credits of elective courses specified in the PhD curriculum; this course will replace an elective course offered in the master curriculum.

Students have the opportunity to spend the third semester at one of the Institute's partner universities as part of its exchange programmes. At the end of this period abroad, these students will be able to transfer a maximum of 30 ECTS credits.

## Master en économie internationale Master in International Economics

Le plan d'études porte, entre autres, sur le commerce, le développement, l'économétrie, la macroéconomie, les crises financières, le changement climatique, l'intégration régionale, les migrations et l'histoire de l'économie.

The Master in International Economics combines a focus on economics with the Institute's multidisciplinary teaching in other key subjects to give students a broader view of economic policy. Courses cover trade, development, econometrics, macroeconomics, financial crises, monetary and financial systems, natural resource economics, climate change, regional integration, migration, economic history and more.

Chaque étudiant a la possibilité d'effectuer, au cours de son troisième semestre d'études, un semestre d'échange hors les murs dans l'une de nos universités partenaires. Il peut alors transférer un maximum de 30 crédits ECTS.

Each student is allowed to spread out the elective courses over semesters 1 to 4, but must take into account the following regulations:

- Students must take a certain number of courses in their discipline of specialisation and in complementary disciplines;
- It is obligatory for students to obtain a minimum of 18 ECTS credits each semester;
- Failed courses cannot be repeated during the fourth semester of studies.

Students interested in the fast track option must obtain the 90 course credits required by the curriculum by the end of the third semester. In the third semester, students on the PhD programme in International Economics must take one of the two Doctoral Seminars that are supposed to be taken in the first semester of the PhD programme; and students on the PhD programme in Development Economics must take one of the two Doctoral Seminars in Development. These courses will replace one of the elective courses included in the master programme curriculum. Students admitted to the fast track programme cannot take one of the two courses "Econometrics IIIA" or "Econometrics IIIB", which are reserved for master students who are writing a dissertation.

Students have the opportunity to spend the third semester at one of the Institute's partner universities as part of its exchange programmes. At the end of this period abroad, they will be able to transfer a maximum of 30 ECTS credits.

## PhD in International Economics

The PhD programme in International Economics offers advanced training focusing on trade and international monetary economics. As part of the programme, students produce a thesis that represents a substantial contribution to the discipline while also helping them strengthen their ability to combine independent research with formal methodologies and the tools of modern economics.

This curriculum has been designed according to an ideal course load of 30 ECTS credits per semester, so that the fourth semester can be devoted to the writing of the Master dissertation. Each student is allowed to spread out the elective courses over semesters 1 to 4, but must take into account the following regulations:

- Students must take a certain number of courses in their discipline of specialisation and in complementary disciplines;
- It is obligatory for students to obtain a minimum of 18 ECTS credits each semester;
- Failed courses cannot be repeated during the fourth semester of studies.

Students interested in the fast track option must obtain the 90 course credits required by the curriculum by the end of the third semester. During the third semester, these students must take in advance "Doctoral Seminar I", which is supposed to be taken in the first semester of the PhD programme; this course would replace an elective course offered in the master curriculum.

Students have the opportunity to spend the third semester at one of the Institute's partner universities as part of its exchange programmes. At the end of this period abroad, they will be able to transfer a maximum of 30 ECTS credits.
