G2 Conference on Dispute Resolution and International Economic Law

July 11, 2018 ♦ Washington, DC

Georgetown's Institute of International Economic Law and the Graduate Institute, Geneva's Center for Trade and Economic Integration will be hosting a one-day conference on dispute resolution and international economic law. The conference will be the 18th year in which the two institutions (the "G2") have organized summer events, and this year the meeting will take place on the Georgetown Law campus, in anticipation of the Society of International Economic Law's annual meetings.

The G2 conference will explore dispute resolution broadly, comparing insights and strategies from international trade, financial regulation, tax and monetary affairs. Academics from law, economics, and political science, as well as regulators and policymakers, are invited to participate, and we hope to provide unusual conversations and strong networking opportunities for those in the field.

To mark the event, we will select participants to present and share their research on panels with policymakers and other academics. Suggested topics for the conference include:

- Navigating Brexit/NAFTA/TPP: Coping Techniques Across Disciplines?
- Technology's Impact on International Economic Law: Fissures and Remedies
- Extraterritoriality: Evolving Lessons in Its Deployment, Justification and Circumvention
- Law and (the New) Economics: How Governments are Using IEL to Generate (or Take) Economic Growth and Competitiveness
- Multilateralism and Dispute Resolution: Evolving Trends, or Coming to an End?
- The Changing Relationship of Corporations and the State in International Economic Law
