<b>Application Deadline</b>	Fall Semester: 1 July Spring Semester: 1 November (doctoral students only)
<b>Admission criteria and application procedure</b>	The application process is online only. All materials in support of your application must be uploaded to that <a href="#">application system</a> prior to submission. GRE scores are not required. Students who have completed a 3 year BA degree through English must complete an English Verification Form available from the exchange programme's office.

**Additional information concerning housing advice, monthly living costs**

The Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS) will issue a visa to non-U.S. citizens who are accepted and can demonstrate sources of funding for an estimated \$2,342/month for cost of living expenses and who demonstrate sufficient insurance coverage [cost estimate is adjusted each year in spring, normally March].
