Course Description

This course will explore the changing nature of Health Diplomacy in view of the different power shifts occurring in a multi polar world. It will analyse the interaction between foreign policy and public health and the ways in which countries, international organizations and other actors have adapted their responses. This course can be complemented by the course Global Public Health. Students are advised to take both courses to develop sound knowledge on the connected global and public health issues. Representatives of international organizations and other global health actors will be invited to contribute to sessions to allow students to discuss with decision-makers in global health governance.
