Course Description

This course provides an advanced introduction to international environmental law and policy. It is based on three main components: (I) foundations and principles, (II) substantive regulation, and (iii) implementation techniques. It is intended for students with graduate level knowledge of international law or environmental governance. It focuses on the technical and practical aspects of international environmental law and policy. It is aimed to equip students wishing to work or to undertake research in this area with the necessary tools to understand the contemporary regulation of environmental problems.
